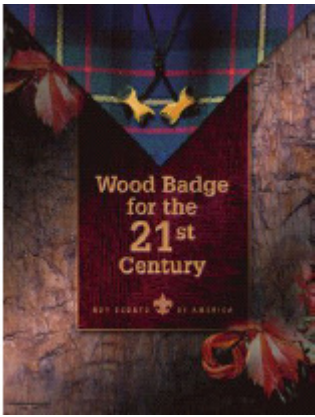

What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is the premier adult training program for the Boy Scouts of America. It teaches contemporary leadership and team development skills in an outdoor setting. Its purpose is to aid Scouters in providing a quality program that will enable Scouts to grow to their greatest potential.

The course encompasses the key concepts of management skills from leaders in the management field. Therefore, this course can be helpful not only in your Scouting job, but also in your career.

The course consists of two parts: practical training and application. Practical leadership experiences are gained in a camp setting where leadership and management skills can be learned and practiced as members of a Wood Badge patrol. At the conclusion of the practical training, each participant will have eighteen months to complete the application phase (ticket) and fulfill the goals they have established.

What are the course prerequisites?

Wood Badge is open to all registered adults who have successfully completed the basic training requirements for their primary Scouting position: New Leader Essentials or the newer This is Scouting, current Youth Protection Training, and position specific training. For Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters, Varsity Coaches, and Assistants, "Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills" is also required. All participants must also submit a current BSA Medical Form.



What equipment do I need?

You provide your own personal gear such as a sleeping bag, toiletries, and a complete Scout uniform (shirt, pants or shorts, socks, belt, and patches appropriate to your Scouting position). Sleeping quarters will be provided for the first weekend. Personal outdoor camping gear will be required for the second weekend. Once your application and deposit have been received by the council office, a detailed personal equipment list will be sent to you.

Do I need special outdoor skills?

Since overnight tent camping and outdoor cooking will be part of the course during the second weekend of the course, some basic camping skills will be helpful but not essential. The staff and experienced participants will help those new to the outdoors to have a safe and enjoyable experience.

How much does it cost?

The course fee is **\$260** per person. This includes six days of training, all instructional materials, meals, a Wood Badge neckerchief and t-shirt, as well as the training award that is presented following the completion of your ticket.
